
These workshops will be with a different chef each week and will cover basic cooking skills, simple recipes based on vegetables you can grow in the garden and issues around eating sustainably.

#### The Youth Voice - Joining the Conversation on Sustainable Transport in Waterford

The Southern Regional Assembly, Green Schools and Waterford Institution of Technology joined forces to host a webinar on February 25: The Youth Voice – Joining the Conversation on Sustainable Transport in Waterford.

Some of the great work being conducted by schools working on the Travel and Global Citizenship Travel themes in Waterford City and County was highlighted. The objective of this event was to give a voice to the young people of Waterford to speak about their experience of sustainable transport in terms of the work they are involved in, the challenges they are facing to travel sustainably and the opportunities to improve sustainable transport. A lot of the issues raised are common to schools all around the country and not just in Waterford.

A panel of experts were assembled to answer the questions that were most important to the youth of Waterford. These included representatives from the Department of Education, Green Schools, The Southern Regional Assembly, Waterford City and County Council, The Green Party, Transport Infrastructure Ireland and the National Roads Authority.

It was obvious from the webinar that there is a huge amount of work being done by schools who are working hard on increasing sustainable travel in their schools. Well done to all involved and keep up the good work!
