- Between 80 and 90 million Easter eggs eaten each year, this is a growing issue. In fact, more than 8,000 tonnes of packaging waste is generated each Easter.
- Cigarette butts remain Ireland's biggest litter source.

On a positive note

- Last Easter, Irish residents recycled over 58,000 tons of waste.
- You can get an on the spot fine of €150 or €4,000 as

a maximum fine - Hopefully this will prevent people from littering!

Home Tips!

- Always pick up your rubbish and put it in the correct bin.
- Make sure you use a compost bin at home for food waste.
- Label your bins at home so that you know what goes where!
- Put all of your recycling straight into the green bin.
- Use compostable bin bags for your kitchen waste.
