Some packaging isn't recyclable so it goes to a landfill (giant dumps for human rubbish) or to be incinerated. They may sound like good ways to dispose of waste and litter. However, there isn't enough land for use as landfill sites. Then when we burn litter or waste, it releases dangerous and toxic chemicals into the air.

Soft plastic used to be a non-recyclable item but plastic producing companies are beginning to fix that so newer plastics can be reused OR they can decompose more quickly and safely. Over the busy Christmas season of buying and gifting please, recycle soft plastic properly; check the labels for the recycle instructions.

😝 Better Plastic 😜

Supermarkets use cheap, easy to buy plastic but that's bad so if you want to use good plastic why not make your own/!

How to make your own plastic. You will need water and potato starch. Follow these steps.

- 1. Add 15 g of potato starch to a 500 ml jug
- 2. Add 100 mls of water to the jug
- 3. Add 10 mls of white vinegar
- 4. Add 10 mls of glycerine
- Add food colouring (optional)
- 6. Mix 2.5 gs of sodium bicarbonate and 30 mls of water, but don't add them to the Mixture yet
- 7. Mix the potato water on a stove until gluey substance forms
- 8. Add the bicarbonate and water now
- 9. Spread the mixture as flat as you can on greaseproof paper
- 10. Wait 2 3 days for the mixture to dry
