This term our pupils will engage with <u>Engineers Week</u> (7/3/22 - 11/3/22) at the start of the month and with the <u>BTYS Primary Science Fair</u> (29/30th Mar) at the end of the month. They will also be involved in our own <u>Bayside SNS Climate Action Project</u> between the midterm and Easter. They will learn to gather data about Climate Change by engaging as scientists with anemometers, rain gauges and thermometers.

Room 7 pupils have entered the RTE/Microsoft 'Ireland's Future is Mine' competition with a wonderful presentation on envisioning a more sustainable Bayside School community using Minecraft for Education, which is available to preview on the school website. They are also participating in the *DCU 'Minecraft in Education'* research.

Bayside SNS is also very happy to welcome back past pupil Calvin Kearns as part of the 'Microsoft Hour of Code' in schools. Calvin will run coding workshops with some of our 5th and 6th class pupils.
