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# Bayside SNS joins over 500 Primary Schools nationwide saying 'Yes' to Languages!

Ms Guiney's 3rd class, Ms Browne's 4th class and Ms O Brien's 6th class are taking part in the Primary Language Sampler starting the week of October 3rd. The sampler module is a means for raising awareness among pupils of the range of languages used by their peers, in their schools and community. Over 500 schools nationwide are taking part and offering modules in a range of modern foreign languages and Irish Sign Language.

The module will introduce the pupils to French (in 3rd & 4th) and Spanish (6th class) and will be taught over a 6-week period during the normal school timetable. Ms Guiney, Ms Browne and Ms O' Brien are delighted to be involved in sharing their language and experience with the pupils, having gained the skills while living, studying, travelling and working in France and Spain.

Ms Lynch commented; 'I appreciate the importance of languages as a life skill, an opportunity for the pupils to think in a different way and build opportunities for the future. With a variety of languages being used by the pupils and staff at our school, this module really helps to build awareness and celebrate the diversity within the school and community'. The module is being rolled out over three terms, with the support of Languages Connect and PPLI (Post-Primary Languages Ireland), a unit of the Department of Education. A suite of resources has been produced including lesson plans for teachers and tutors and 'Language Passports' for all participating pupils to show their family and friends. Packs have been sent to participating schools to help support both the teaching and learning, but also awareness raising objectives of the module.



Languages Connect promotes the personal, social, professional and economic benefits of foreign language skills to principals, teachers, parents and students. Funded by the Department of Education and facilitated by Post Primary Languages Ireland, as a key objective of the Languages Connect – Ireland's for Foreign Languages in Education 2017 – 2026.
